Rumah Sri Kenangan (RSK), a home for the aged, received special attention from two kind-hearted organisations on Wednesday.

The Ministers and Assistant ministers Wives' Association (SABATI) members led by Datin Judith Chan distributed ang pows to the Home residents in conjunction with the coming festivals of Chinese New Year and Hari Raya Aidilfitri.

Judith, wife of Deputy Chief Minister Datuk George Chan, also presented a RM2,000 cheque to Madam Whilmina Tan, chairman of the Home's Visitors Board.
